Dear Members of Congress,

The undersigned 193 national, state, and local organizations representing millions of people across the country, including directly impacted immigrant communities, border communities, faith leaders, and civil and immigrant rights advocates, urge you to reject the White House's supplemental funding and reprogramming requests for detention, enforcement, and surveillance operations within the Department of Homeland Security. As Congress is already considering appropriating billions of dollars for the next fiscal year for agencies separating immigrant families and militarizing border communities, granting this funding request will only inflict greater harm.

The funds requested for DHS would:

- Provide nearly \$1 billion in unrestricted funding to Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and Customs and Border Protection (CBP);
- Grant over \$100 million in added funding for invasive surveillance programs;
- Reimburse the Department of Defense for military deployments to the border;
- Authorize ICE to develop a grant program for new "community-based residential facilities," which would effectively reinstate family detention by another name

Congress should not simply hand \$917 million to ICE and CBP for "response to migration surges." This would only perpetuate the abuses already rampant within these agencies' detention and enforcement operations. Just a few weeks ago, <u>news broke</u> of a DHS Office for Civil Rights and Civil Liberties report on ICE detention in which "the expert inspectors found 'negligent' medical care (including mental health care), 'unsafe and filthy' conditions, racist abuse of detainees, inappropriate pepper-spraying of mentally

[disabled] detainees and other problems that, in some cases, contributed to detainee deaths." Meanwhile, <u>evidence suggests that CBP has been colluding with Texas state police</u> to implement Operation Lone Star, <u>policies which include forcing children and nursing women back into the Rio Grande using razor</u> wire, denying water to asylum seekers suffering in extreme heat, and installing a <u>floating river barrier</u> <u>armed with saw blades</u>. Border Patrol detention also claimed the life of 8-year-old <u>Anadith Danay Reyes</u> <u>Álvarez</u> in May and agents in Arizona shot unarmed <u>Raymond Mattia</u> nine times that same month, both tragedies extending the agency's deplorable track record of "<u>preventable</u>" custodial cruelty and excessive force. More money enables more such abuses and deaths.

Further, Congress should not provide DHS with additional funds for <u>cross-border data sharing</u> and surveillance technology that harms border communities and invades the privacy of all people, regardless of immigration status. The <u>HART database will vastly expand the agency's already terrifying</u> biometrics data collection and <u>systematically abused</u> surveillance power. Military deployments, too, exacerbate dangerous false narratives surrounding the border, while doing nothing to provide humane aid and access to legally mandated relief that asylum seekers actually need. Additionally, the "voluntary returns" referenced in the supplemental request are nothing of the sort, and instead represent a coercive practice in which DHS officers strongarm uncounseled asylum seekers to give up their claims and return to danger, rather than supporting their legal right to seek asylum.

Finally, Congress *must not* grant ICE the reprogramming authority it seeks to fund the development of "community-based residential facilities," which are <u>reportedly envisioned</u> for asylum seeking families and would in effect reinstate family detention by another name. Though these facilities would be operated by non-governmental organizations, the program would still be housed under ICE and require organizations to restrict people's freedom of movement during certain hours and allow enforcement personnel on site—creating another form of custody that still leaves migrants vulnerable to the harms of enforcement. Further, we are concerned that the administration intends to create these facilities outside of the existing minimal standards of oversight and care, creating another arena where the abuses detailed above can be perpetuated. Immigrant children and families should be welcomed with dignity, into networks of loved ones where communities actually support individuals humanely, instead of further dehumanizing them via surveillance and abuse.

The supplemental also includes a request for additional funds for the Shelter and Services Program. Funding for communities and localities welcoming people as they seek a better life and safety in the United States is a critical investment that we support and encourage Congress to consider. However, we continue to advocate for this program to be moved out of CBP's purview and for <u>urgent concerns</u> that have been identified with the designation and distribution of funds to be remedied.

Our tax dollars should not go towards further harm and abuse. Again, we urge you to reject the supplemental funding and reprogramming requests outlined above for Immigration and Customs Enforcement and Customs and Border Protection.
